
System of airports

TIX - Strengths and Opportunities Assessment

Strengths:

- Existing property footprint (1,650 acres) could support additional revenuegenerating facilities
- Proximity to I-95, SR 407, SR 405, and KSC
- Highly capable airfield and facilities to support corporate and business aviation
 - 7,300-foot runway with Instrument Landing System
 - Air Traffic Control Tower
 - ARFF facility
 - Foreign Trade Zone #136
- FAA-licensed horizontal spaceport
- Independently operated Airport Authority

Opportunities:

- Development and investment from aerospace companies and third-party developers
- Improvements to landside access and circulation could increase developable space and improve aesthetics
- Proximity to existing rail and port infrastructure
- US Customs and Border Protection Facility (demand-driven)
- Continued partnerships with funding agencies and regional entities
- Private sector development and investment

X21 - Strengths and Opportunities Assessment

Strengths:

- General aviation facility with a broad range of aeronautical activities including skydiving
- Existing airfield capacity would support increased aeronautical activity
- Non-aeronautical tenants diversify revenue stream for TCAA
- Independently operated Airport Authority

Opportunities:

- Land use optimization could yield additional developable space
- Excess airfield capacity could be leveraged to attract additional aeronautical tenants including flight schools and MRO operators
- New GA/FBO terminal facility with selffueling opportunities
- Private sector development and investment
