APPROVAL OF MINUTES

TITUSVILLE - COCOA AIRPORT AUTHORITY

The Regular Meeting of the Titusville - Cocoa Airport Authority was held on May 16, 2024, 4 p.m., at the Titusville - Cocoa Airport Authority Office, 355 Golden Knights Boulevard, Titusville, Florida, and via video conference. The following members were present: Mr. Donn Mount, Vice Chairman; Mr. Al Voss, Treasurer; Ms. Jessica Curry, Secretary; Mr. Roger Molitor; Mr. Mark Grainger; Mr. Kevin Daugherty, AAE, Director of Airports; and Mr. Adam Bird, Attorney. Mr. John Craig, Chairman; and Mr. Brad Whitmore attended via video conference.

Call to Order

Mr. Mount called the meeting to order and determined a quorum was present.

Pledge of Allegiance

Members and attendees recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of the Agenda

Mr. Mount called for any changes or corrections to the agenda. Mr. Daugherty stated that Action Items B, C, and D were added to the agenda as last-minute Grant Amendments (project time extensions) from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). Mr. Molitor made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. Mr. Voss seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion passed.

Approval of Meeting Minutes:

1. April 18, 2024 – Regular Meeting

Mr. Mount called for a motion to approve the April 18, 2024; meeting minutes as presented. Mr. Molitor made the motion. Mr. Grainger seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion passed.

Action Items

1. Lease

a. Approval of Aeronautical Commercial Lease Agreement between Titusville-Cocoa Airport Authority and Voyager Aviation International LLC, Merritt Island Airport Mr. Daugherty reviewed the material terms and conditions associated with the Aeronautical Commercial Lease Agreement between Titusville-Cocoa Airport Authority and Voyager Aviation International LLC, located at the Merritt Island Airport, and called for any questions and recommended approval.

Ms. Curry questioned if a five-percent increase per year is standard. Mr. Daugherty stated it is a standard increase per the Titusville-Cocoa Airport Authority.

Mr. Daugherty discussed the details regarding the FDOT Grant Amendment #2 and Associated Resolution - Design and Construction of Replacement AWOS located at the Arthur Dunn Airpark and recommended approval.

Mr. Mount called for a motion to approve as presented by Mr. Daugherty. Mr. Molitor made a motion to approve. Ms. Curry seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion passed.

c. Approval of FDOT Grant Amendment #2 and Associated Resolution - Design and Construction of Replacement AWOS, Merritt Island Airport (FPN 450522-1)

Mr. Daugherty discussed the details regarding the FDOT Grant Amendment #2 and Associated Resolution – Design and Construction of Replacement AWOS at the Merritt Island Airport, called for any questions and recommended approval.

Mr. Mount called for a motion to approve as presented by Mr. Daugherty. Mr. Molitor made a motion to approve as presented. Mr. Voss seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion passed.

3. Invoices

a. April 2024

Deputy Director of Operations and Maintenance Report

a. Capital Improvement Projects Update

Mr. Hopman gave details regarding the corporate hangar project at Merritt Island Airport. The facility is nearing completion and will be ready for final inspection next week.

Mr. Hopman stated the Automated Weather Observation System (AWOS) at Arthur Dunn Airpark is in service. The phone line is scheduled to be activated tomorrow. The demolition of the former AWOS site and equipment is scheduled for next week.

Mr. Hopman stated that staff is coordinating with Florida Power and Light (FP&L) representatives to resolve the utility issue with the AWOS site at Merritt Island Airport.

Mr. Hopman stated the Challenger Avenue Extension Design plan is 90% complete. The site plan is currently being reviewed by the Space Coast Innovation Park Phase 2 drainage consultants.

Mr. Hopman stated the Runway 18/36 design project at the Space Coast Regional Airport was publicly advertised for competitive bid this week. Depending on funding, the project should commence in January 2025.

Mr. Hopman stated the construction of the new Airport Traffic Control Tower is currently advertised for bid. The public bid opening is scheduled for May 23rd.

Mr. Hopman stated there were only two noise complaints for the month of April, which both came from Merritt Island Airport.

Mr. Hopman reviewed the daily operations at each airport.

Mr. Hopman stated the T-hangar inspections at the Space Coast Regional Airport are almost complete and will soon begin at Merritt Island Airport.

Deputy Director of Finance and Administration Report

1. Audited Financial Statements for Year Ended September 30, 2023 Carr, Riggs and Ingram

Mr. David Knowlton, from Carr, Riggs and Ingram, gave an overview of the financial statements that were audited for the year ending September 30, 2023.

2. Check Register

Ms. Kinard presented the check register for April 2024 and called for any questions. There were none.

3. April Financial Statements

Ms. Kinard gave an overview of the financial statements for the month of April 2024 and called for any questions.

Mr. Voss questioned the status of any tenant that is in arrears with their monthly rents. Mr. Daugherty stated at present, Space Perspective is approximately 60 days in arrears with partial payments being made.

Mr. Craig questioned whether communication is made from Space Perspective in advance of missing their monthly payments. Mr. Daugherty stated that Space Perspective has been coordinating with the staff in advance.

Authority Attorney Report

Mr. Bird stated there were no updates.

Authority Member's Report

Mr. Mount called for any comments or questions from the Board. Mr. Molitor mentioned the Master Pilot Award, this coming Saturday, to present and congratulate Mr. Al Voss.

Mr. Craig gave a reminder of the yearly evaluation coming due in July for the Director of Airports, Mr. Kevin Daugherty.

Public Comments

Mr. Mount called for public comments.

Mr. Marc Issott, shareholder from Islands International Group, located at the Merritt Island Airport, introduced himself to the Board members and indicated that the company was interested in settling the current lease dispute.

A RESOLUTION (EMERGENCY) APPROVING FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANT AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO GRANT FPN 446673-1-94-01 EXTENDING THE PROJECT END DATE FOR THE TIX FUEL FARM RELOCATION DESIGN AT SPACE COAST REGIONAL AIRPORT.

WHEREAS, on May 30, 2024, the Titusville–Cocoa Airport Authority (the "Authority") adopted Resolution (Emergency) No. 00-24-09, which approved FDOT Amendment No. 2 to Grant FPN 446673-1-94-01 for an extension of the project end date for the TIX Fuel Farm Relocation Design at Space Coast Regional Airport.

WHEREAS, the Director of Airports of the Authority was informed by FDOT that failure to validly approve FDOT Amendment No. 2 via Resolution on or before May 31, 2024, would place the receipt of the Florida Department of Transportation Grant FPN 446673-1-94-01 (the "Grant") by the Authority in jeopardy, including without limitation the permanent loss of some or all of the funds related thereto.

WHEREAS, since there is insufficient time to obtain a vote of the Authority's Board of Directors at a regular Authority Board meeting, the Director of Airports of Authority has determined that pursuant to the "Emergency Actions" provision of Section 102.00 of the Authority's Policy Manual the loss likely to be incurred by the Authority if this Resolution is not passed and provided to FDOT by May 31, 2024 represents an immediate danger to the welfare of the public since, without limitation: (a) any funds no longer available from the FDOT through the Grant would have to be paid by the Authority and, therefore, would represent the unexpected expenditure of public funds by the Authority, thereby negatively affecting its budget and finances, and (b) the Authority may not have the financial ability to meet its project obligations but for the receipt of all available funds to be paid through the Grant. As a result of the foregoing, this Resolution is necessary to protect the public interest.

WHEREAS, the Authority will subsequently ratify this Resolution at its next regularly scheduled Board meeting currently set for June 20, 2024.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Authority's Policy Manual, this Resolution is valid and effective for ninety (90) days from its execution until it is ratified by vote of the Authority

CURRENT STATUS: Reviewed 90% drawings. Seeking additional funding to accommodate a regional drainage area in support of the roadway and development.

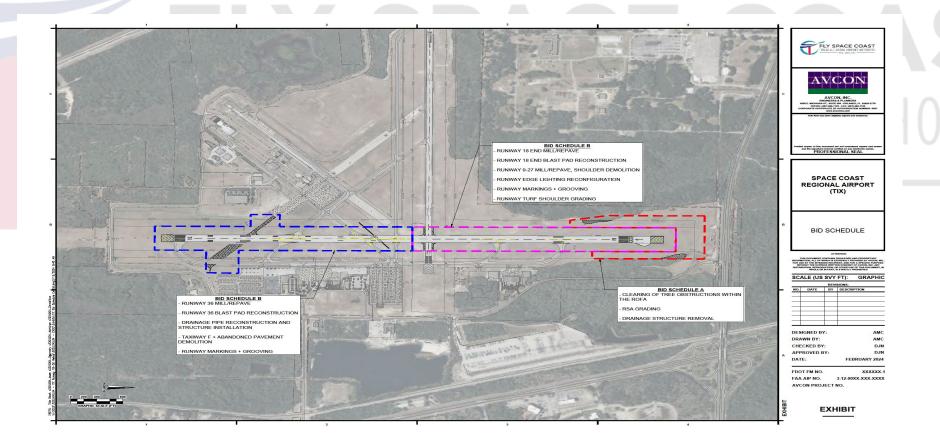




PROJECT: TIX RWY 18/36 Rehabilitation (Design)

CURRENT STATUS: Bids have been received and are currently being reviewed; grant applications are being drafted for submittal to the FAA and FDOT for project funding.



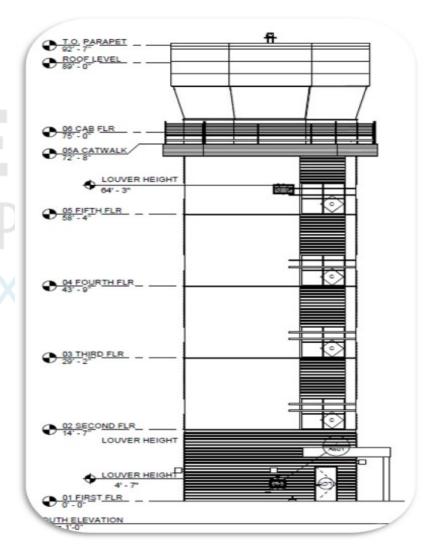
PROJECT: Design of the Replacement Airport Traffic Control Tower – Space Coast Regional Airport

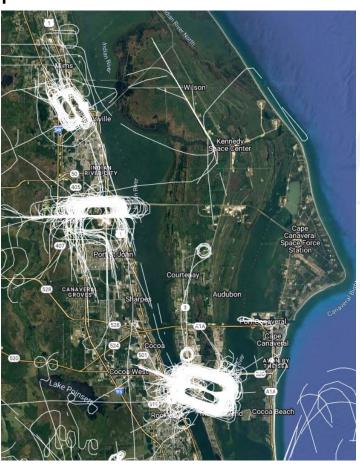

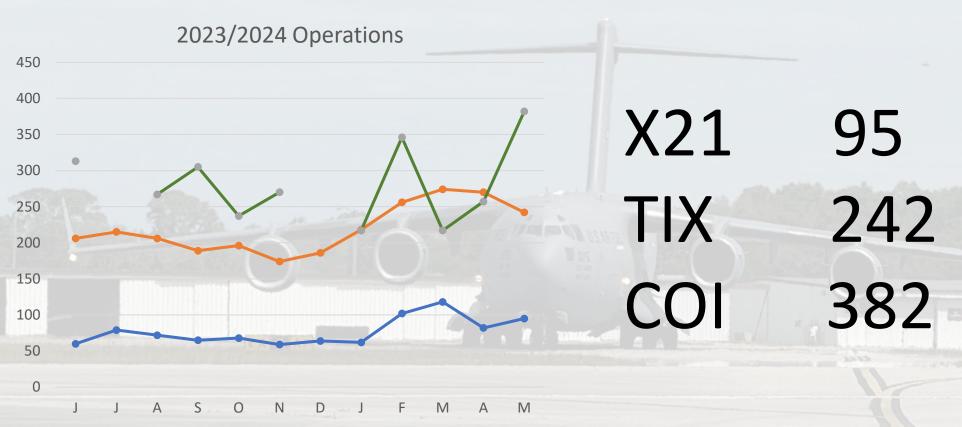
